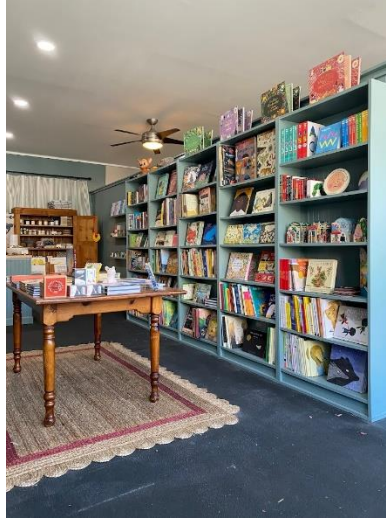
Catskills Coffee Lodge & The Junction

Opening at 8am, The Catskills Coffee Lodge is a charming spot to start your day, and with its great beer selection, craft cocktails and cozy company, the bar at The Junction (open until 11p) is a nice way to wind it down.

Callicoon Wine Merchant & Tapas Bar in Callicoon

This gem, located on Dorrer Drive just off Lower Main Street in Callicoon (a 30 minute drive), packs a lot into a small space. Enjoy some of the best food in the area prepared by Chef Robin Mailey (we're talking salt cod croquettes, ricotta drizzled with honey and chocolate mousse) at the tapas bar. Then - without having to step outside - shop the well curated wine store and bring home a bottle for later.

Ratty Books & R52Home in Jeffersonville

Located on Main Street in Jeffersonville (a 20minute drive), you'll find several shops and places to eat and we highly recommend shopping two new stores starting with R52Home, which is located inside Sullivan Sundries.
